

## WCRHA MEMBER SPOTLIGHT A story about a young lady and her amazing horse...

#### Campbell McLeod and Reeboks Rerun

The McLeod Family bought Reeboks Rerun in 2013 so their two girls, Campbell and Mackenzie, would have a safe, talented, good-minded gelding to learn reining. Campbell, then 9 years old, quickly took to Reebok and the pair dominated the short stirrup classes all the way to Oklahoma City at the Futurity Show and North American Affiliate Finals. The following year, Mackenzie got to have her turn with Reebok and the duo started out in Green as Grass at Gold-n-Grand, taking the reserve championship in the spring. Mackenzie was torn between reining and competitive gymnastics so Reebok had a pretty easy show season throughout 2014.

In 2015 all that changed because Campbell was promised to have Reebok back to achieve her ambitious goals for the year. After spending 2014 showing the McLeod's good mare, Smooth Sailing Chic, in the 13 and under and rookie youth classes (although Campbell was still age qualified to show in short stirrup), Campbell was eager to get Reebok back in the show pen and get to perform full patterns with him (short stirrup patterns are abbreviated and don't require lead changes). Campbell set lofty goals that included making the top ten in NRHA standings, qualifying for the Youth AQHA World Show, and trying her hand at some more difficult venues and events to build experience and confidence.

The year started out a little rough as Campbell learned to control Reeboks' lead changes in the show pen – he thought he knew the patterns better than Campbell. It took a few shows to hammer those out and the pair started finding their rhythm. The pair hit the Cactus Classic in March, taking home Reserve Champion honors in Rookie 1 and DRHA Rookie (just missing out on two saddles), and top five in the youth circuit award.

Toward her goal of competing in tougher events to steel her nerves and improve her showmanship, Campbell entered up in the Rein for the Roses \$1,000 added Non Pro Maturity. The team made an impression with spectators and the judges, earning a fourth place finish and Campbell's very first Category 2 paycheck. The following month, the pair showed in the Murieta Equestrian Center \$5,000 added Non-Pro Shootout, placing fifth (? I think) in the level 1.

Later in the spring, Camp-

bell spotted a Facebook post from Larson Performance Horses announcing a youth clinic to be instructed by Jordan Larson, Casey Deary and Jason Vanlandingham. She immediately submitted an essay on why she loves reining and what it means to her. Jordan and Taylor Larson were quick to select Campbell's submission and said they could feel the passion in her words.

With the help of friends (Sherry Yohey, Melissa Moore and Kim Lansidel), the McLeod family made a plan to get Reebok and Campbell to Texas. The clinic was going to be held the weekend before the NRHA Derby in Oklahoma City so they decided to make additional arrangements to allow Campbell the opportunity to show in the ancillary classes. Campbell was assigned to Casey Deary's team at the Larson Youth Clinic. After a full day of drills, practice and coaching, the clinic participants competed on the second day for NRHA

> judge Joe Hayes, where Campbell and Reebok earned the highest score in the Larson Ranch Youth Clinic, winning a Yucca Flats show blanket.

The McLeod family wanted Campbell to have the support from her trainer, Martin Padilla, while she showed at the Derby in OKC. To sweeten the deal for Martin to come out and help Campbell for a few days, the McLeod's told him he could show Reebok in the Intermediate Open. There were two slates totaling \$4,000 in added money, along with a circuit high point buckle.

Reebok won the following awards at the NRHA Derby:

- Champion Intermediate Open slate 1
- Champion Intermediate Open slate 2
- High Point Champion Intermediate Open

Show for Nampa, Idaho. They will need to qualify at the Northwest Affiliate Championship before they can move on to OKC for the NAAF. The NAAF show is held in conjunction with the NRHA Futurity the last week of November and first week of December.

We completed our "Star Spangled Slide" show on July 1st through the 5th at the Brookside Equestrian Park in Elk Grove, CA. As usual, Bill and his Brookside crew rolled out the red carpet for the West Coast Reining Horse Association. We always appreciate his great hospitality. Red, white and blue decorations were everywhere making Brookside very festive. While the week started out hot, the weather cooled to average for this time of the year setting the stage for a great show.

There were many fun activities to distract us from the rigors of showing our horses. A few of the events included the annual Pot Luck hosted by Delbert Tullos, the BBQ and Fireworks on the Fourth and of course, the annual dog and trainer races. A big thank you goes to Ollie Galligan for sponsoring the dog races. New for this year was a "cannon ball" contest in the pool. While I did not see the contest, I heard that it was well attended and was fun to watch. I even heard the spectators got wet from some of the bigger cannon ball splashes.

We held our second ever "Lead Line Classic" for our youngest riders. It is always so much fun to see these young cowboys and cowgirls ride their ponies in this class. And new for this year, we held a "Young Rider Class". The Young Rider Class is an introductory class for youth and is designed to get new youth (10 and under) riders into the show pen without the expense of a regular NRHA class. There are no ownership or membership requirements. The only requirement is that the contestant may not have shown in a reining class before. This class is run concurrent with the NRHA Short Stirrup Class and uses the same pattern. WCRHA will be doing both the Lead Line Classic and Young Rider classes at our year end show in October. For more information about these classes please see the show premium.

I want to wish each and every West Coast member continued success as the 2015 show year winds down. I hope each and everyone one of you who reads this is having a great summer and show season. Happy riding and showing!


With the NRHA top ten standings in her sights, Campbell needed to pick up a couple of additional shows so they decided to go the Oregon Reining Horse Association Classic in Medford, OR in August.

Reebok won the following awards at the ORHA Classic:

- Champion Rookie 1
- Champion 13 and under youth
- Champion Intermediate Open (tie)
- Reserve Champion Open

Campbell and Reebok are looking forward to the opportunity to try and qualify for the NAAC in OKC in youth 13 and under, and they look forward to competing at the High Roller Reining classic in Las Vegas. For now, the plan is to scale back Reebok's show schedule for 2016, limiting it to a few maturity events and the AQHA youth world. Not many 13 year old show horses with a career as intense as his has been (futurity champion, world champion, multiple national titles), are still in the show pen today. Reebok continues to be sound, fit and completely happy being a show horse. The McLeod family, however, recognizes that with age he may be more prone to injury and they don't want him to ever be in pain so the plan to limit his show activities is in place. He is an extraordinary horse and not just physical talent, but personality and kindness.







## **BROOKSIDE SUMMER REIN 2015**

In August, one never knows what to expect with the weather. It could be a warm 106 or a cool 86. The Summer Rein show was blessed to enjoy the lower temperatures and cool breezes. The Summer Rein show is an NRHA approved and WCRHA approved show and was judged by Johnette Burman from Montana and BJ Le Master from Sacramento over the 3 days. We started the show at 7:30 on Friday and with the cooler temps we started the show at 9 on Saturday and Sunday.

A Friday Night draw party was held at the Elk Grove Milling Pavilion and hosted by Lorraine Kemper, Future Homes & Real Estate. We served 105 carnitas taco dinners and then the exhibitors were called to the stage oneby-one to select their positions in Non Pro and Open Futurity and received a gift card and a Brookside Wine Glass. the Open winner was Mike Boyle. Congratulations! Upon completion of the show, everyone headed over to the Elk Grove Milling Pavilion and Wine Down bar to enjoy a hamburger dinner, the Brookside famous Grape Stomping competition, and a birthday celebration for local trainer, Martin Padilla.

For consistency sake the show started on Sunday at 9am with the Novice Horse Non Pro and Open which was run as a concurrent class, followed by the rookie and some open classes. It was a full day of showing finishing up with the Brookside Green as Grass horse class that is available for 1st year horses under 5 years old.

Brookside Show Park offers two high point buckles and they were presented to the winners at the Summer Rein. The Brookside Daily Double buckle requires the exhibitors to show

in the Brookside Green as Grass class at the Rein for the Roses and the Summer Rein on the same horse. The exhibitor with the highest cumulative total from both shows wins the buckle and this year, the winner was Laura Johnson riding Vintage Sparks. The 2nd buckle is for the Rookie Professional class. The Rookie Pro must show the same horse in the Rookie Pro class at Rein for the Roses, the WCRHA July Affiliate #5 and the Summer Rein. This year the Rookie Professional with the highest cumulative score was posted by Chuy Chavez, riding Smart Like Steady owned by Kathleen Jackson. See you in 2016!

## WCRHA, together WE CAN have an IMPACT in the fight against cancer.



What is "Slide for the Cure"? Have you heard of Slide for the Cure? This is a benefit program that that was started in 2008 which helps support the fight against cancer by running concurrent reining classes during some of the WCRHA shows.

Melynda Silvashy, along with her mom Bonnie, started Slide for the Cure to honor her Aunt Barbara who gave a great fight, but lost her battle with breast cancer. With the help of the reining community, so far, Slide for the Cure has raised over \$34,000!

100% of the funds we raise is donated to (OHSU) Oregon Health and Science University. OHSU specializes in target tumor cancer therapies. In 2013 Nike co-founder Phil Knight announced he would make a matching donation of \$500 million if OHSU and the Knight Cancer Institute raised an additional \$500 million in two years. So far they are at 93% of their total and are expected to reach the goal sometime very soon.

The plan with this money is for OHSU to hire 20 to 30 top scientists and their teams to collaborate on improving methods to identify cancer at its earliest and most curable stage. The early detection initiative builds upon Knight Cancer Institute's pioneering research that has changed the direction of cancer treatment from toxic, non-specific chemotherapies to highly targeted drugs that zero in on cancer without harming healthy cells. Early detection and DNA sequencing is believed to be the first step to actually ending cancer. No politics, just plain and simple research which saves lives!
