For a mere \$75 entry fee, a person could enter the "Battle for the Saddle," execute the run of their choosing..... maybe fast and furious....maybe clean and correct....maybe something in the middle....and at the conclusion of the class, roll a pair of giant red dice whose total would then be added to their score, providing an added element of suspense as to who would proudly take home a custom ordered Silver Spurs Saddle of Scottsdale sponsored by Rolling Hills Casino and Equestrian Center.


Comprised of Youth riders, a Green as Grass, both seasoned and less seasoned Non Pros and a handful of Open riders, the field of 21 was set to "gamble for the saddle." The strategy of some riders was to run big and amass as many points as they could in the sand, leaving less chance to the dice, while others showed clean and steady in hopes of rolling a high number in order to supplement their score, and then there were those entries who were in it to participate, support a fun new class, and hope that a clean pattern and a big roll would be the combo that would take home one of the great awards offered up to all of those who paid their entries and took a chance.

The evening event began with 13 year old Maggie Chancellor, who despite the fact that her horse Steady Like a Star, challenged her at every step, exited the arena to the cheers of a supportive crowd, a smile ear to ear, and the beaming pride of her mom Sandy and coach Amy Walden. Behind Maggie came sport newcomer and Green as Grasser Stephanie Munzinger and her brand new gelding Aces High Ace who hauled off and laid down a clean pattern on their maiden voyage together in the arena. Again, smiles all around as Stephanie exited the arena, heart pounding and thrilled to be competing, anxious to see what her roll later in the evening might contribute to her total. And so the evening progressed with scores ranging anywhere from a 146 to a 127, nothing would be taken for granted until each rider rolled their dice at the end of the evening.

At the completion of the class, a pizza party sponsored by Osphos and Jessica Marvis would commence at the in gate for riders, sponsors, trainers, coaches and anyone who

had been there to clap and cheer, while the magic dice and buckets of awards were schlepped to the center of the arena where only minutes before riders had been spinning and sliding their way to possible stardom. With everything in place, the dice were warmed up and ready to roll as each contestant took their turn at adding up to 12 free points to their final score. Rolling in order of their go, Maggie Chancellor was the first one on the podium and managed to roll a 2 and 3, adding 5 points to her original score. Stephanie Munzinger, who entered both the Non Pro and the Open, was permitted two throws, one for each class. Snake eyes would do little to gain her the saddle in the Non Pro, but a total of 6 would help move her ever so slightly up the Open placings. Martin Padilla had knocked out the second highest score of the evening with a 146.5, but luck would not be on his side as the dice turned up a whopping total of 3, making his total a 149.5, 2½ points shy of the top spot. Three riders in, Martin's total was still the high score, but it was anyone's guess how long that would hold. Following Martin, Dave

Hanson would see the lucky side of the dice as he managed to roll a 6, bringing his total to a 150 and putting him in the top position where he would remain for the next five riders. But his reign would be brief as Kain Emmons managed to woo Lady Luck once more, rolling a 6 and taking the lead with a total of 152. Six more riders to roll....each to the cheers and jeers of his or her fellow competitors as each one willed their pair of dice to outshine those who had rolled before them. When the dust settled and the points were tallied, Kain Emmons and Tereasa Canada's Ez On The Slide would be the Open victors with a 152 total, leaving the Reserve Champion position to be split between Dave Hanson and Laetitia Loubser's A Wayward Revolution and Kelly Keenan riding Paola Troia's Suga Suga. Britta Jacobson and Ms Benz with an arena score of 142 and one of the highest rolls

of the night, an 8, would have a total of 150 and take home the custom order Non Pro saddle for her efforts, leaving the Non Pro Reserve Champion position to Bailey Alexander and her horse Ima Ugly Stick, with a total score of 148.5 after an 8 was added to her arena score of 140.5.

However, all was not lost for those who fell short of the top spots because thanks to the hard work and dedication of Britta Jacobson, who worked tirelessly gathering a host of awesome sponsors, every entry went home with something fabulous to commemorate their participation in the second annual Battle for the Saddle. Of course, there were the Silver Spurs Saddlery of Arizona saddles sponsored by Rolling




Rolling Hills Equestrian Center "Roll of the Dice" Affiliate #1 Reining Show

Corning, CA—The weather tricksters were at work during the first West Coast Reining Horse Association affiliate show of the year held March 2-4 at the Equestrian Center at Rolling Hills Casino in Corning. California reiners don't get to show in snowy weather too often, but the snow that was predicted on Warm Up day, thankfully, did not materialize. In fact, rainy weather held off during the show days and visited only during the night time hours, much to the relief of the exhibitors. A special, educational treat for the exhibitors was a talk on Osphos and its uses by Jessica Morris.

Judges Ollie Griffith and Pete McAlister judged a full range of NRHA Reining classes as well as a variety of AOHA approved Reining and Ranch Riding classes. Starting the show off on the first day was the Open slate. With a score of 73.5, Mike Boyle, showing Elizabeth McHugh's Chics Dream, earned first place in the Open, closely followed by David Hanson on Stephanie Munzinger's Aces High Whiz with a 72.5. With scores of 71.5, the top two placings in the Intermediate and Limited Open classes were shared between Ollie Galligan showing Margaret Daly's Gunnachicya and Warwick Schiller showing his own Shine Spook Shine. Chics Love Chrome and rider/owner

Patricia Eckhoff rode away with first place in the Primetime Open with a 71 score. Lavonne Sturgeon and her beloved California Shines won second with 68.5. Cody Rowe swept the Rookie Professional class by capturing three of the top four placings! He took first place honors with Larry Pearle's Electric Kit with a winning score of 70.5. Cody, on Richard Boer's Dreamin About Wimpy, tied for second with Kaity Sotomayor riding Julie Beach's Spook N Cody with scores of 70. Finishing up the Open section was the AOHA Open Reining, featuring 17 entries. Chics Dream and Mike Boyle took the class. Ollie Galligan showing Gunnachicya tied for second with Martin Padilla, on Tobyann Faingold's Spangled Desire.

With the onset of the afternoon. the Rookie and Green reiners took to the arena. Paige Pastorino and Taylor Made Magnum won both Rookie Level 1 and 2 with a score of 71. 70.5 earned West Coast Hick and Randy Engler a second place in Rookie 1 and a tie for second in Rookie 2 with Mercedes Shiningstar ridden by Margaret Munro. Randy also won Primetime Rookie. Sharing second, with scores of 70, were Laetitia Loubser and her Coronas In Hollywood and Michele Auzenne and her Oakanic. In the WCRHA Green Reiner class, Natalie Cook





rode Marlena Got Nicd to the win with a score of 69.5, with Kelly Staley and Star Trek Tag coming in second with a 68. Lisa Dentoni, riding Mr Twister Whiz, won the AOHA Amateur Level 1 Reining.

Since a lot of reiners are adding Ranch Riding to their repertoires, the WCRHA club decided to support those interests and are offering a variety of ranch riding classes to their shows this year. Kaity Sotomayor extended the trot, jogged over poles, and more to garner three of the top five placings in the AQHA Open Ranch Riding class. Riding Catamia Oak, owned by Mary Mendoza, Kaity won the class with a score of 77. Paige Gentry on her Nu Steppin Shoes was second with 73. In the AQHA Amateur Ranch Riding, Stacy Hamilton on her Californya Girl rode to first with 74 and Ginger DeGrange on her TR The Big Easy was second with 70.5. For the more mature exhibitor, the AQHA Amateur Select Ranch Riding class provided Derek Brummett and his palomino mare, Thischicsamistress, the format for a win with a score of 76. Michele Auzenne and Oakanic earned 73.5 for their efforts to place second in the class. The AQHA Amateur Level 1 Ranch Riding, for the less experienced in this venue, was won by Aces High Whiz and Stephanie Munzinger with second going to Colleen Morris on Out West In Levis. Margaret Chancellor showed Dunnit With A Shine to a score of 72.5 for the win in the AQHA Youth Ranch Riding with Baily Alexander on Ima Ugly Stick coming in for second with 71. The

WCRHA Ranch Riding All ages was won by Kelly Staley on Star Trek Tag with a 73. Mari Hess and her Steppin Up Haidas took second with a 72. All in all, the ranch riding classes were well received and enjoyed as something a little different!

A brisk morning ushered in the second day of competition with the NRHA Green reiners. Sharing first place honors in the Level 1 were Elizabeth Atkins on Almighty Chic and Margaret Chancellor on Dunnit With A Shine, both with scores of 69. Paige Pastorino riding Taylor Made Magnum topped the scoreboard in Level 2 with a score of 69.5, with Elizabeth Atkins taking second on her Almighty Chic.


First place in the Snaffle/ Hackamore 5 & Under went to Miss N Wimpy, owned by Barbara Morlan and shown by David Hanson, scoring 72.5. Darkestsideoftheboon, earning the second place award with a 71.5 for owner Jill Cenedella, was ridden by Ron Emmons.

With a 71.5, Patricia Eckhoff topped the Non Pro board with her Chics Love Chrome by taking home first places in Non Pro, Intermediate NP, Limited NP, Primetime NP, and AQHA Amateur Reining. Congratulations, Patricia! Debi Murnan and her Jacs Red Pine earned second places in Non Pro, Intermediate NP, and Primetime NP with 71. Placing second with 70.5 in Limited NP was Elizabeth McHugh showing Chics Dream. Co-first places in the Masters NP were awarded to



As the afternoon warmed up a bit, the Youth were next to hit the show arena. Claiming first place prizes in 13 & Under and the AQHA Youth Reining was Margaret Chancellor on Dunnit With A Shine, scoring 71. Mya Clader earned second in the 13 & Under on Tammi Clader's Katie Tag with a score of 66. Bailey Alexander and her Ima Ugly Stick took the top awards in the Youth 14-18 and Unrestricted Youth classes with 69.5 as well as second place in the AQHA Youth Reining. Kristen Rodocker rode her Shining Doc Colonel to second place finishes in the 14-18 and Unrestricted Youth with 68.5. Stars Revolution, guided by Abby Lubin to a score of 65, won the Youth Rookie. Congratulations to all the WCRHA youth exhibitors! You were all winners by just "playing the game!"

A fun, unique competition, open to all exhibitors who felt "lucky," was held Saturday evening—Battle for the Saddles. A roll of the dice was added to each exhibitor's reining score to determine who would win a saddle in the Non Pro class as well as the Open class. Kain Emmons rolled the dice and, for the second year in a row, won the saddle for the Open division. How "lucky" is he? Britta Jacobson added her dice roll to her reining score to win the saddle for the Non Pro division. (Read more about this fun

There was something for everyone as all 21 exhibitors left with gifts and goodies sponsored by HorsLic, California Embroidery, Caboy Hattery, Equine Oasis, and The Show Pad & Michelle Miola.

Another brisk, yet sunny, morning welcomed the Green As Grass horses and their riders to the pen on the final day of the show. Mackenzie McDowell and her Timber Winner emerged as winners, scoring a 71. Coming in second was Paolo Troia-Cancio on his grey mare Suga Suga with a 69.5.

Finishing off the show were the Novice Horse Non Pro and
Open classes. Splitting first place in the Non Pro Level 1 were Britta
Jacobson riding her Ms Benz and Mari Hess showing her Steppin Up Haidas, with scores of 71.5. Besting a class of 19 entries in the Non Pro Level 2 was Ken Hamilton on his Hollywood Voodoo with 72. Sharing second place were Jacobson and Hess.

In the Novice Horse Open Level 1, Mike Boyle came in first and second respectively on Pamela Hurst's Rock N Roll Baby with 72.5 and the McLeod Family Farms' A Gun Show with 71. Martin Padilla rocked the very competitive Open Novice Horse Level 2 class with a 74.5 to win first on Spangled Desire for owner Tobyann Faingold. Sharing second with big scores of 73.5 were David Hanson on Stephanie Munzinger's Aces High Whiz and Christian Rammerstorfer on his own Reinsincalifornia.



DERBY AWARD SADDLES

****NEW FOR 2018**** DERBY OPEN LEVEL 4 & NON PRO LEVEL 4 CIRCUIT SADDLE AWARDS****

Starting in 2018, there will be saddles awarded at the year end show to the circuit winner of the Derby Open Level 4 and the circuit winner of the Derby Non Pro Level 4.

The Circuit consists of:

- 1. Affiliate #2 Rein for the Roses, Derby Open Level 4 and Derby Non Pro Level 4 Classes
- 2. Affiliate #4 Star Spangled Slide, Derby Open Level 4 and Derby Non Pro Level 4 Classes
- 3. WCRHA Year End Show, Derby Open Level 4 and Derby Non Pro Level 4 Classes

The owner must nominate their horse as they currently do for the regular year end awards before any points are counted and all owners and riders of the horse must be current members of WCRHA before any points are counted.

Must be the same Horse and Rider Combination in all 3 shows.

Must have the highest point total from the 3 Derbies listed above (or 2 Derbies if no one has shown in all 3). Points will be calculated per the number shown in each class (example; if there are 5 in the class then 1st place receives 5 points, 2nd place receives 4 points, etc. No points awarded for a zero score). Ties will be broken by money earned.

This will take the place of the saddles previously awarded at the year end show for a single run.

Art thinks of the riders by providing water for the hot days, putting up trivia questions for entertainment, and keeping riders informed of potential ties. Many people do not realize that Art VOLUNTEERS his time to run the gate and is at the show before it starts to set up his special boards with the schooling runs and is there every morning ready to go before the show starts and there late at night when the show ends so he can prepare his boards for the next day's classes. For these reasons, Art Fingerle is truly an inspiration for his many years of unselfish giving of his time and energy to WCRHA and its members, all with a smile on his face. Congratulations, Art!

YOUTH SADDLES ARE NOW YEAR END AWARDS

In addition to the regular year end class awards of buckles to Champion and Reserve Champion, jackets to the top 5 and other awards to 3rd, 4th, and 5th places, starting in 2018, there will also be a SADDLE awarded in the following YOUTH classes as a year end award at the banquet:

YOUTH 13 & UNDER YOUTH 14 to 18

The owner must nominate their horse as they currently do for the regular year end awards before any points are counted and all owners and riders of the horse must be current members of WCRHA before any points are counted. The ONLY shows that will count for points towards the SADDLES are:

WCRHA Affiliate #2 WCRHA Affiliate #3 WCRHA Affiliate #4 WCRHA Year End Show

The points will be counted as they are for the regular year end awards. Ties will be broken by whoever has the highest reining score at the year end show.

There is no minimum number of shows that must be attended to qualify for the saddles but all points earned at Affiliates 2-4 and year end show will count.

It is possible that the same person who wins the saddle for a class does not also win the Champion Buckle in the class.

The regular year end awards will be calculated as per usual with other approved shows counting for points and a minimum of 4 shows must be attended and 3 shows for short stirrup. See wcrha.com under "points, shows and year end awards" for details.

This will take the place of the saddles previously awarded at the year end show.





This will turn out to be a great convenience to the WCRHA membership.






